

**HAWES FARMERS AUCTION MART CO LTD
LIVESTOCK MARKET REPORT**

TUESDAY 25th NOVEMBER 2025

Forward: 1703 Sheep comprising 1416 Prime Lambs, 287 Cast Ewes and Rams.

PRIME LAMBS

As seen nationally, the prime lamb trade continues to climb, with a stronger trade again this week in Hawes. More lambs were easily sold, and additional numbers could have been handled to the vendors' advantage. The overall market average was just over 300p/kg, including 583 Mules and over 320 horned lambs.

The trade for continental lambs saw export-type lambs meet a slightly sharper demand, while heavy-weight lambs remained a similarly strong trade. Topping the market this week were well-conformed, heavy-weight Beltex lambs, selling to £186 at 56kg from BC Gregg, Masham. This was followed by other heavy-weight Texels selling to £180 from D Hodgson, Askrigg, with plenty more heavy lambs making around £170. Heavy-weight Suffolk lambs topped at £159, also from BC Gregg, Masham. There were plenty of pens of well-fleshed, handy-weight lambs selling between 320p/kg and 330p/kg.

It was noticeable that Mule lambs sold to a stronger trade, averaging 303p/kg, with handy-weight Mules in the mid-40kg range easily making around 310p/kg. Heavy-weight Mule lambs sold to a top of £160 on three occasions—from R & E Cowperthwaite, Settle; WA Dinsdale & Son, Grinton; and K & A Woof, Marsett—with many more heavy Mule pens selling in the £150s. The overall average for Mules was £142.10 a head.

There was the largest entry of the season of 320 horned lambs, which sold to a market average of 274p/kg, topping at 313p/kg from JR Blades, Muker. Lightweight, well-fleshed horned lambs were in strongest demand. Horned lambs topped at £140 for Dalesbreds from DL Mudd, Buckden. Scotch Blackface lambs sold to £134 from P Dinsdale & Son, Carlton, and Swaledales peaked at £129 from ME Bainbridge, Richmond.

There was also an increased entry of Cheviot lambs, which were well bid for, selling to a top of £147 and £145.50 from Megan Hallam, Horton-in-Ribblesdale.
